Minister's Letter

'See how these Christians love each other'.

I was reminded of these words by one of the Elders at our recent Elder's Gathering in the church. They are great words aren't they?

The quote is from the early church father Tertullian. Tertullian lived in the ancient city of Carthage (which is now in modern Tunisia). Little is known of his life, but he was one of the first Christian writers to write in Latin and lived around 200 AD.

His quote above, is from the perspective of an outsider looking at the Christians. The full quote is actually this:

"Look," they say, "how they love one another" (for they themselves hate one another); "and how they are ready to die for each other" (for they themselves are readier to kill each other). (Tertullian's Apology, 39.6)

The quote is a stirring one of course, because as Christians we want to reflect the difference that Christ has made in our lives and the change he has wrought. And we hope that as Christ's love is reflected in us - then those on the outside will notice and be attracted - that they too might come to know Christ.

Now, of course, it is also a challenging quote because we realise so often we fall short of loving one another as Christians. We fall into sin. We gripe and back-bite and are bitter at times. And we are left wondering - do outsiders see any chance in me? Do they see anything that would attract them also to come to Christ?

Jesus said in John's Gospel:

'A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know

that you are my disciples, if you love one another'. (John 13: 34,35)

The love that we share with one another as Christians makes a big impact on the people around us - possibly bigger than any persuasive argument we could make.

It sets Christians apart that people begin to look and to wonder!

Often of course, it is difficult to love and often takes an act of the will, especially when difficult decisions have to be made - or people are tired and cranky.

But as we understand how much the Lord has loved us in Christ - in dying for us, saving us and giving us new life - then in return we ought to love him and love one another.

As John writes in his first letter:

'Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.' (1 John 4: 11).

Maybe as we move through 2013, that would be our prayer and our aim. That individually we would grow in love and that our church fellowship would be known as a place of love as we love each other.

For surely our prayer is that when those in our community look at the church - they marvel and say: 'Look how these Christians love one another'.

Who wouldn't want to be in a church like that?

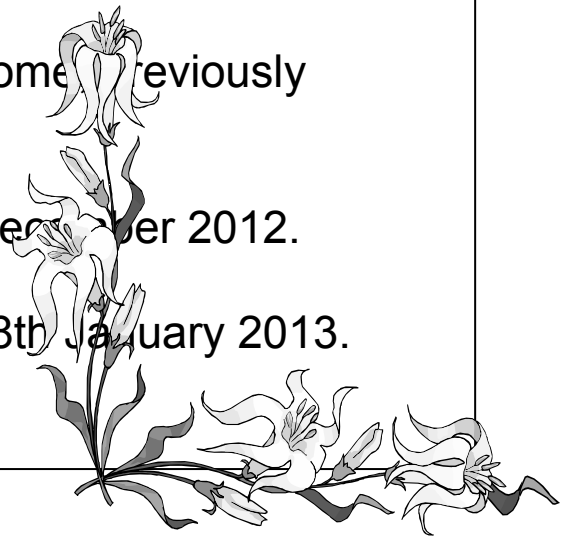

SAFEGUARDING POLICY

Welcome to the first of a series of articles on safeguarding – protection of children and adults at risk from harm or abuse.

Who is a child or adult at risk ?

A child is any person under the age of 16 years of age. In certain circumstances this definition is extended to any person under the age of 18.

An adult at risk can be considered to be any person over the age of 16 affected by physical disability, learning disability, mental health problems, dementia or long term illness that you suspect or know is being harmed or abused, or is harming themselves, *and* who is unable to protect themselves. Not all people affected by disability or old age are vulnerable just because they are affected by a disability or are older !

What is harm or abuse ?

Harm or abuse includes physical, emotional, mental, sexual or financial forms of damage. Children or adults at risk can be at risk of harm or abuse that has not actually (yet) happened.

The term 'abuse' is used more often in relation to children. The term 'harm' is the preferred term when referring to adults at risk.

The Church of Scotland policy on safeguarding, within the context of an inclusive church, is shown above and is displayed at the entrance to the Bill Penny Hall and on our web-page.

It is important that we realise that harm or abuse of children or adults at risk can happen anywhere – even in church communities and services. If you suspect or witness harm or abuse to a child or adult at risk (including historical harm or abuse), or it is reported to you, you must report it immediately to one of our Safeguarding Co-ordinators.

Dear Friends

Thanks you so much for your recent gift of £216.39. We are truly grateful for how part of this gift was raised from small change collection boxes.

Your generosity helps Tearfund, as part of the global church, to bring material and spiritual transformation to people living in poverty across the world – in places like Ethiopia.

Birtukan is from a very poor family in Ethiopia, and was working as a beggar to feed her children. So when she

heard that Tearfund's local partner Ethiopian Kale Heywet Church (EKHC) was helping people financially, she wanted to be part of it. 'I heard the church was giving out money,' she says, 'so I ran to be one of the first in the queue!'

However, the church wasn't handing out money – it was forming self-help groups. 'They (the staff) said they would teach us how to save, and manage what we have.'

Birtukan joined a group and started by saving some of her begging money each week. After a while her group saw her commitment, and offered her a loan from their savings. She bought onions and charcoal to sell at market. Slowly, her business grew. Birtukan now runs a successful market stall, and has taken and paid back several loans from her group. Her husband used to work far away, but is now able to live with his family and help with the business.

Not only is this family now united and financially stable, their dignity has been restored. 'People have stopped insulting me,' says Birkutan. 'They now respect me, and will touch me, like a proper person.'

Please pray for the EKHC team as they lead this project, that they will feel God's love and blessing powerfully as they work to bring God's love and blessing to others.

Thank you for your part in empowering people like Birkutan to escape poverty and lead dignified lives.

Thanks!

A big thank you from all our members in nursing homes for the gift they received at Christmas.

Mrs Helen Aitken, 18 Headrigg Gardens, thanks most sincerely all those who remembered her with cards, gifts and good wishes at Christmas time, Their kindness is much appreciated.

This report is to update all on the progress of the Refurbishment Fund. As I write this we are waiting on Presbytery to confirm that we can accept a very generous loan from a member of the Congregation.

The project still to be funded is £426000 as at 12.12.2012. The funds held for the Fabric / Refurbishment are £343000. Based on the draft Accounts for the year ended 31.12. 2012 – (which still have to be audited), the difference being £63000.

We have been offered an interest free loan of £100,000 but as with all loans, this will have to be paid back. Fund raising as you are aware has already started - £2629 was raised last year.

There are Fund Raising Efforts planned for the future for the Refurbishment Fund and to help reduce the amount we are required to borrow.

The loan has to be paid back over 10 years at £10,000 per year and as such, we will have to find additional funds to do this. It is always difficult to keep asking for more. I know that some Members have pledged and some members are using the refurbishment envelopes.

Overton Church building is still on the Market, however till this is sold we require to find funds to be able to pay off the loan.

Just a thought – there are Yellow Envelopes on the pews for the Refurbishment fund. If 100 people put £1 in an envelope on a Sunday that would bring in £5200 per year, and if gift aided that £1 becomes £1.25. However, please, if you consider this do not decrease your normal giving as we still have to run Christ's Church in the village and also meet our commitments to the Wider Church.

I am not asking this for me, or the Finance Team, or the Fabric Team or even the Session I am asking you to consider this for **our Church**.

Scottish Bible Society

As our church's representative for the Scottish Bible Society I thought I would fill you in about what has been going on.

Almost a year ago the children in Junior church raised over £100 by decorating and selling little cup cakes at coffee time. Also for two months in the summer the Rendezvous coffee donations went to the Scottish Bible Society so between these two donations last year we were able to give almost £500 towards their work.

I received a letter from them in December informing me what all the donations they had received were used for.

£44,500	was given for “Scotland/Peru” (Bibleworld)
£83,000	for “Bibles for China's Millions”
£30,000	for “Dominican Republic – Bibles instead of Weapons”
£49,000	for “Iraq – Holistic distribution of Scriptures”

They continue to need to raise funds in order to help others around the world.

Recently I have been able to collect lots of used stamps from the congregation including a lot of old postcards from an elderly member of the church and someone from the Scottish Bible Society is coming to pick them up for their “Operation Family” project.

Calendars from the Bible Society Bible-a-month Partnership are now available. Each month shows a different country and project which is being supported and by donating just £4 each month we can help support it. For example, in January, £4 would provide two children's Bibles for children in orphanages in Ukraine.
